Tomatoes and Banjos

On May 5th and 6th, Langham Court Theatre, in collaboration with Blue Bridge Repertory Theatre, hosted the award-winning production, *Tomatoes Tried To Kill Me But Banjos Saved My Life*. Inspiring and entertaining, this sold-out event told the exceptional true story of performer, Keith Alessi, who left the world of corporate board rooms to follow his long-delayed passion – playing the banjo! When faced with a deadly cancer battle, Keith's musical pursuit took him on a journey that became the key to saving his life. Told through authentic storytelling, heartfelt humor and music, the show was an uplifting story of challenge, triumph, and the power of positivity.

Having toured internationally, including sold-out runs across Canada, Off-Broadway in New York City, and at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival (it was rated in the top 16 Fringe shows in the world), Tomatoes was originally scheduled to be performed at the Roxy Theatre, and was staged at Langham as a fundraiser for Blue Bridge and Langham Court Theatre when the Roxy became unavailable – with all ticket proceeds going to the two organizations. In addition, noting his appreciation for Langham's dedicated and welcoming volunteers, Keith generously donated \$2000 specifically to Langham, commenting that it was the best-run theatre he had ever performed in. Thank you, Keith!


