There were wonderful performances in our last show of the season, and all involved did a great job managing some sold out shows in the July heat! There was also a great night when lots of the cast and crew, along with other assorted Langham members attended the National Theatre Live production of *Present Laughter*. This production had multiple awards for Andrew Scott as Garry Essendine and a modern twist on the Noel Coward classic. What fun to see this production from the Old Vic.

As we head into our 95th Year, I thought I would share a bit of what I assume is a bit of unknown Langham history. Recently I was talking with a long-time Victoria resident who shared with me that he grew up in the Langham neighbourhood on Burdett street. He had a group of 5 friends who liked to roam the neighbourhood. It was 1951 and he was about 11. The group of boys and one girl, aged from 11 to 13, would

'jimmy' their way into Langham (he assured me it wasn't a break in as it was far too easy for them to gain access to the theatre) and make their way up to the costume loft and spend the afternoon trying on different costumes! What wonderful to think of these kids parading around for each other in the loft in the early 50's pretending to be characters on a stage! He said he couldn't remember exactly whose idea it was to sneak into the theatre and assured me there was no motivation behind the decision and no destruction took place. His memory is that the exploration was simply bored kids having fun. He did however, point out that one of those misfits went on to be the owner of the Pentray Inn and Tea House on Belleville street, but didn't think she would mind him sharing his story

For our final production of the season we look forward to having Reconciliation Theatre join us on the August long weekend for performances of Nice *While it Lasted – Coming of Age on a Burning Planet* by Dan Puglas. Tickets are available through the box office.

Timely and touching, *Nice While it Lasted* weaves the emotional journey home for Hunter, an indigenous twenty-something who fears he's missed his last chance to reconnect with his traditional culture. As the life Hunter left behind clashes with his urban influences, fireseason threatens the very survival of the community he loves. This searing tale explores coming of age on a burning planet; running out of time when you've only just begun.



It opened in Nanaimo over the Canada Day weekend and will visit a number of venues on the Island, including Campbell River, Courtenay, and Qualicum Nation. RTS was awarded a 2024 Anti-Racism grant from the Ministry of the Attorney General.

Callbacks will be held Sunday, September 8 – 1 to 4 p.m. (by invitation only)

Read-through with the chosen cast and crew will take place Saturday, September 14 – 1 to 4 p.m. Rehearsals start Tuesday, September 17 and will run Tuesdays and Thursdays – 7 to 10 p.m. and Saturdays – 1 to 4 p.m.

CHARACTER REQUIREMENTS

All roles are open to all regardless of race and ethnicity.

- Mrs. Reynolds (60s) The house keeper at Pemberley, knows all, sees all, has been on staff since Darcy was a child. A mother figure to the household.
- **Brian** (20s-30s) A footman in love with technology and inventions, sincere and earnest, perhaps a bit arrogant.
- Cassie (20s-30s) The new housemaid, a village girl, an orphan who came from less than nothing. The opportunity to work at Pemberley means security she has never had, and she takes this job very seriously. She is sometimes maybe too eager and a bit headstrong.
- **Mr. Fitzwilliam Darcy** (20s-30s): Head and owner of Pemberley.
- Mrs. Elizabeth Darcy (20s-30s): Mistress of Pemberley. Strongly independent.
- **George Wickham** (20s-30s): Grew up at Pemberley, son of former steward, once a soldier, has been in and out of trouble his whole life (of his own making).
- Lydia Wickham (20s-30s): A bright, warm and charming personality is sometimes bit much, eloped with Wickham at 15 and is now somewhat trapped in this marriage.
