

Don Nigro – Author

Don Nigro was born on September 30, 1949 and currently lives near Malvern, Ohio. He grew up in Ohio and Arizona. He received a Bachelor of Arts in English from Ohio State University in 1971 and a Master of Fine Arts in dramatic arts from the Playwrights Workshop at the University of Iowa. His plays *Anima Mundi* and *The Dark Sonnets of the Lady* have both been nominated for the National Repertory Theatre Foundation's National Play Award and he won a Playwright's Fellowship Grant. Nigro has written more than

500 plays. One of his plays, *Ravenscroft*, was adapted into the film *The Manor*, with Peter O'Toole.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Ravenscroft is a play that masterfully blends elements of mystery, dark comedy, and psychological intrigue, offering audiences an experience that is both unsettling and thought-provoking.

At its core, *Ravenscroft* is a story about the enigmatic nature of human relationships and the lengths to which people will go to protect their secrets. The characters in this play are intricately woven together by lies, half-truths, and the

haunting presence of guilt. Each interaction peels back another layer of their personas, revealing the darker aspects of their psyches.

In approaching this production, I was particularly drawn to the way *Ravenscroft* plays with the conventions of the classic murder mystery. While it contains all the elements of a whodunit—suspicion, motives, and a detective seeking the truth—it also subverts these elements, leaving the audience questioning not just who committed the crime, but whether the crime itself even matters in the grand scheme of the story. The real mystery lies in the characters' minds and the twisted reality they create for themselves.

I am incredibly grateful to the talented cast, crew and production team for their dedication and creativity in bringing this complex narrative to life. Their contributions have been invaluable in shaping this production into what I hope will be a memorable and thought-provoking experience for all who watch it.

Thank you for joining us on this journey into the mysterious and the unknown. I invite you to enter *Ravenscroft* with an open mind, ready to question, to doubt, and, perhaps, to see the world a little differently by the time you leave.
