

DIRECTOR'S NOTES



The past: I started my journey in the theatre in February 1995, appearing in *Romeo and Juliet* for the Manila Metropolitan Theatre. Ten years later, I experimented with deconstructing a monologue for a cast of ten performers paving the way for my directorial debut and giving birth to *Battle Cry*, a production that catapulted my directing engagements with independent drama groups. Fast-forward to the present, *Now and Then* marks

my thirty years as a theatre practitioner.

Jacqollyne Keath, Production Chair, introduced me to *Now and Then*, and I immediately got a kick out of it. The play examines the battle between aspiration and reality, the what-ifs of the past and the future. It questions the satisfaction we currently enjoy and the regrets we suffer later on because of our choices. "Given the opportunity, what would you tell your younger self?" may sound cliché, but it could be the most profound question we could ever ask ourselves that'll provide the truth and, ultimately, our salvation.
